Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC
licensed events.

When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy
holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.

If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water
available to drink.

Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.

When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.

Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of
water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.

Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths
of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to
dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

**WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE
NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.**

Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the
needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default,
omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General
Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.

Right to Refuse Entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel
Club Regulation to refuse any entry.

18. Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry
form and must be Kennel Club registered.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION F (B)

- These Regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club
Licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show
Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42.
 - A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition
at the show and from any award gained there at.
 - Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations
then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.
- No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any
purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may
be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show.
 - Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be
allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.
- No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed except:-
 - Operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee.
 - The removal of dew claws of any breed.
 - Operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered
dogs are shown.

Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive.

- The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any
examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from
the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.
- An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in
the same breed or class. An objection may, however, be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by
the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to
substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club will substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its
behalf.
- Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these regulations must be made in writing to the Show
Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show & the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of
lodging the complaint.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- OPENING OF SHOW:** The Show will open at 9.00 a.m.
- Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.
- Judging will commence at 10.00 a.m. prompt.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. **CLOSURE OF SHOW:** The Show will close half an hour after all their judging has been completed.
- The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of the tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.
- ENTRY FEES:** for each dog entered. Members - First Class £12.00; Non-Members - First Class £14.00; Subsequent classes £2.00. Children's Handling Classes 25p. Not for Competition £2.00. Membership £8.00 Joint, £7.00 Single—Catalogues £2.00 (£2.50 on the day).
- Prize money on offer at this show—£25 for Best in Show, £10 Best Opposite Sex, £5 Best Puppy, £5 Best Veteran.
- The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- BEST PUPPY IN SHOW:** Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same Show. A puppy is a dog of six months and not exceeding 12 calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a Puppy it will automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Similarly, if the Reserve Best in Show is a Puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it will also automatically be Best Puppy in Show. Consequently selection Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show. Best Puppy in Show must be selected from Puppies which have been judged and which are unbeaten by any other puppy.
WITHDRAWAL FROM OTHER COMPETITION: Puppies which become eligible for Best Puppy in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best Puppy in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A Puppy beaten in Competition for Best Puppy in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dog declared Best Puppy in Show, however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
PROVISO: For the purpose of this Regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to one breed will not be considered to be a beaten dog.
- BEST IN SHOW:** The dog declared Best in Show is a dog which has competed and is unbeaten by any other dog exhibited at the same Show. Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex providing they are unbeaten winning dogs. Reserve Best in Show must be selected from the Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show must not compete in any subsequent competition.
WITHDRAWAL FROM OTHER COMPETITION: Dogs which become eligible for Best in Show maybe withdrawn from all other competition other than breed classes prior to the competition for Best in Show as appropriate in order to remain unbeaten. A dog beaten in competition for Best in Show may subsequently be exhibited in all competition for which it was previously eligible. The dogs declared Best in Show and Reserve Best in Show however, must not compete in any subsequent competition.
PROVISO: For the purposes of this regulation, dogs beaten in competition for Stud Dog, Brood Bitch, Progeny, Brace & Team or a Special Award confined to a single breed, will not be considered to be beaten dogs.
- ADMISSION TO BEST IN SHOW:** Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably been delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with a special permission of the Show Management.
- REGULATIONS:** No modifications will be made to this schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition. All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

FACILITIES

THE KENNEL CLUB BREEDERS CLASS WILL TAKE PLACE AFTER ALL JUDGING IS COMPLETED.

The new competition will start in January 2009 with a Crufts Final In 2010 and the main features are:

- Competition scheduled at all Championship shows for every breed, with or without CCs (Breed Club, Sun Group, Group and General Championship Shows included)
- Entries can be made on the day of competition
- Breeders become eligible to enter by having bred four dogs being present and exhibited at that show in that breed
- Competition judged by the breed judge immediately after awarding Best of Breed and Best Puppy in Breed
- Best Breeder in Breed goes through to a Best Breeder in Group Award
- A cumulative points system will be applied to all wins
- 20 points available per calendar year (1 point for a breed win, 4 points for winning a Group, 3 points for coming second in Group, 2 points for third place in Group, 1 point for fourth place in Group)
- After achieving 20 points in a calendar year breeders withdraw from competition for rest of that year.
- 20 points required to qualify for Semi Final or Final at Crufts in following year. (The total number of successful qualifiers may dictate that additional heats or qualifications may be necessary to secure a place in the Final.)

Note: Please see Show Manager to enter on the day

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm.

If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

CAR PARKING AREA is large.

The COFFEE BAR, which provides soup, bacon rolls, biscuits, soft drinks etc., available all day. Access to the hall may be had through the coffee bar without dogs. Meals are available in the Dining Room.
